Sermon Text: 2 Corinthians 12:1-10 (NIV)

I must go on boasting. Although there is nothing to be gained, I will go on to visions and revelations from the Lord. 2 I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven. Whether it was in the body or out of the body I do not know—God knows. 3 And I know that this man—whether in the body or apart from the body I do not know, but God knows—4 was caught up to paradise and heard inexpressible things, things that no one is permitted to tell. 5 I will boast about a man like that, but I will not boast about myself, except about my weaknesses. 6 Even if I should choose to boast, I would not be a fool, because I would be speaking the truth. But I refrain, so no one will think more of me than is warranted by what I do or say, 7 or because of these surpassingly great revelations. Therefore, in order to keep me from becoming conceited, I was given a thorn in my flesh, a messenger of Satan, to torment me. 8 Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take it away from me. 9 But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. 10 That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong.

PB & Chicken Sunday - 8/25/24

This Sunday is PB & Chicken Sunday (the last Sunday of the month). The need for food at the Baskervill Food Pantry is greater than ever. Your donations allow St. Paul's to provide part of the grocery bag of food given to more than 1,000 local hungry people each month. Of these, roughly 25% are over the age of 60 and more than 25% are 17 or younger. Each week, the Food Pantry fills 130 – 150 grocery bags!

Chicken is needed more than PB as one can of each goes into every bag of groceries. The preferred size for chicken is 12.5 oz (and 1 lb. jars for PB). Financial donations are especially welcome as Duane and Roslyn Keck go to the Myrtle Beach Costco once per month to purchase the canned chicken at excellent prices. As great as the prices they can buy this at, they've gone up 51.5% since October 2021.

If it's easier, you can also give online, or put a check in the offering plate which is labeled for this cause on the memo line. **Note:** if you want to donate other non-perishable food items from your pantry, they are welcome—just bring them to the church in a plastic grocery bag. They can be placed in the black plastic milk crates provided in the Narthex and Berly Hall. **There is a need for non-perishable items donated each Sunday.**

Thank you—you really are making such a difference to the people who live around you.
