Sermon Text: 2 Timothy 2:14-26 (NIV)

14 Keep reminding God's people of these things. Warn them before God against quarreling about words; it is of no value, and only ruins those who listen. 15 Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth. 16 Avoid godless chatter, because those who indulge in it will become more and more ungodly. 17 Their teaching will spread like gangrene. Among them are Hymenaeus and Philetus, 18 who have departed from the truth. They say that the resurrection has already taken place, and they destroy the faith of some. 19 Nevertheless, God's solid foundation stands firm, sealed with this inscription: "The Lord knows those who are his," and, "Everyone who confesses the name of the Lord must turn away from wickedness."

20 In a large house there are articles not only of gold and silver, but also of wood and clay; some are for special purposes and some for common use. 21 Those who cleanse themselves from the latter will be instruments for special purposes, made holy, useful to the Master and prepared to do any good work.

22 Flee the evil desires of youth and pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace, along with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart. 23 Don't have anything to do with foolish and stupid arguments, because you know they produce quarrels. 24 And the Lord's servant must not be quarrelsome but must be kind to everyone, able to teach, not resentful. 25 Opponents must be gently instructed, in the hope that God will grant them repentance leading them to a knowledge of the truth, 26 and that they will come to their senses and escape from the trap of the devil, who has taken them captive to do his will.

Message From Your Pastor

As we continue to examine the limitlessness of God, we remind ourselves that God's love is limitless. When I ponder the love of God, I'm often reminded of the 3rd verse of Frederick M. Lehman's hymn titled "The Love of God". Verse three reads:

Could we with ink the ocean fill, and were the skies of parchment made; were ev'ry stalk on earth a quill, and ev'ryone a scribe by trade; to write the love of God above would drain the ocean dry; nor could the scroll contain the whole, though stretched from sky to sky.

Suffice it to say, that we cannot even begin to fathom how wide and long and high and deep is the love of God. In spite of our sins, failures, and shortcomings, God loves us beyond anything we could earn or deserve. God love us enough to send His One and Only Son to live, die, and rise again for our sake. That we can find forgiveness of our sins and eternal life through our belief in Jesus. The love of God is limitless, inconceivable, and undeserved. It is a gift offered to us without price. It is a blessing just waiting for us to accept.
