57 As they were walking along the road, a man said to him, "I will follow you wherever you go."

58 Jesus replied, "Foxes have dens and birds have nests, but the Son of Man has no place to lay his head."

59 He said to another man, "Follow me."

But he replied, "Lord, first let me go and bury my father."

60 Jesus said to him, "Let the dead bury their own dead, but you go and proclaim the kingdom of God."

61 Still another said, "I will follow you, Lord; but first let me go back and say goodbye to my family."

62 Jesus replied, "No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for service in the kingdom of God."

Message From Pastor JR

Week 5 of the Who We Are! sermon series brings us to the statement, "We are disciples who make disciples." What does it mean to be a disciple? The most basic definition of a disciple is one who follows a teacher. If we as Christians are striving to be disciples, we must desire to follow the teachings of Christ in our lives. For us to be capable of helping others become disciples, we must first become disciples ourselves. Discipleship demands that we learn more about Jesus through reading scripture and bible study. We should have a hunger for God's Word and seek it daily in our lives. Discipleship demands that we desire deeper relationship with Jesus. We develop that relationship through an active and daily prayer life. Discipleship demands that respond to the prompting of the Holy Spirit in faithfulness. Being a disciple is something we do. If we desire to lead others into discipleship, it is imperative that we live out our faith. When our priority is to personally become disciples of Jesus Christ, our actions will reflect our faith. In this way, when others experience us, they get to experience the Holy Spirit living in and through us. This may lead others to deeper understanding of Christ and a desire to grow deeper in their own faith. If we desire to be disciples who make disciples, we must first become disciples ourselves.
