Sermon Text: Luke 9:18-27 (NIV)

18 Once when Jesus was praying in private and his disciples were with him, he asked them, "Who do the crowds say I am?"

19 They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, that one of the prophets of long ago has come back to life."

20 "But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?"

Peter answered, "God's Messiah."

Jesus Predicts His Death

21 Jesus strictly warned them not to tell this to anyone. 22 And he said, "The Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life."

23 Then he said to them all: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me. 24 For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will save it. 25 What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, and yet lose or forfeit their very self? 26 Whoever is ashamed of me and my words, the Son of Man will be ashamed of them when he comes in his glory and in the glory of the Father and of the holy angels.

27 "Truly I tell you, some who are standing here will not taste death before they see the kingdom of God."

Message From Pastor JR

Jesus replied, "No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for service in the kingdom of God." - Luke 9:62. In the final week of the "Who We Are!" sermon series, we stated that our 6th core value is to be Forward Focused. Jesus uses the illustration of the plow to share with His disciples the importance of looking forward, rather than backward. We are tempted in our humanity to look to the past and occasionally dwell in it. The reality is that there is nothing we can do to change the mistakes, hurts, or misfortunes of the past. It is also true that we are can very rarely recreate the good things which have occurred. Yet the temptation is still there to glorify or obsess about the past. As Christians, we must be a people of the present and the future. Just as the one who puts their hand to the plow, we must be focused on the task at hand, in order that we will steer our plows directly into the plan of God. We must be connected to God through His Word, prayer, and faithful response, without looking behind us. God is doing amazing things in our midst and there are many more in the future. Let us be a focused people, seeking God's Will above our own and following faithfully wherever He may lead.
