Sermon Text: Luke 14:15-24 (NIV)

- 15 When one of those at the table with him heard this, he said to Jesus, "Blessed is the one who will eat at the feast in the kingdom of God."
- 16 Jesus replied: "A certain man was preparing a great banquet and invited many guests. 17 At the time of the banquet he sent his servant to tell those who had been invited, 'Come, for everything is now ready.'
- 18 "But they all alike began to make excuses. The first said, 'I have just bought a field, and I must go and see it. Please excuse me.'
- 19 "Another said, 'I have just bought five yoke of oxen, and I'm on my way to try them out. Please excuse me.'
- 20 "Still another said, 'I just got married, so I can't come.'
- 21 "The servant came back and reported this to his master. Then the owner of the house became angry and ordered his servant, 'Go out quickly into the streets and alleys of the town and bring in the poor, the crippled, the blind and the lame.'
- 22 "'Sir,' the servant said, 'what you ordered has been done, but there is still room.'
- 23 "Then the master told his servant, 'Go out to the roads and country lanes and compel them to come in, so that my house will be full. 24 I tell you, not one of those who were invited will get a taste of my banquet."

Message From Pastor JR

As our church continues to grow, it is important that we continue to adapt along with what God is doing in our midst. One of those adaptations is to add a third service on Sunday mornings. Beginning this Sunday (October 6), there will be 3 services: Traditional at 8:45 and 11:15 in the Sanctuary and Modern at 11:00 in Berly Hall. The addition of a third service will enable us to offer more worship options and space for continued growth. I would encourage those who attend the 8:45 service to consider also attending one of the later services as well for the month of October, it probably won't hurt anyone to worship twice on a Sunday for a month. By doing this, you will be showing support for the church growth and will aid in welcoming new people to the church while we are adapting to the new Sunday schedule. This Sunday is World Communion Sunday so we will be celebrating Holy Communion at all three worship services. Moving forward we will celebrate Holy Communion every week at the 11:15 Traditional service, and the first Sunday of each month at 8:45 and 11:00. For the month of October, I will be preaching at the Traditional 8:45 and 11:15 services. Rev. Len Kircher will be preaching at the 11:00 Modern service for the month of October. In November, I will be preaching at the 8:45 Traditional service and the 11:00 Modern service, and Rev. Kircher will preach at the 11:15 Traditional service. The plan at present is for me to always preach the 8:45 service and for Rev. Kircher and I to swap the services during the 11:00 am hour monthly. Please continue to pray for our church as we follow God faithfully into the future. I understand that change can be difficult, but keep in mind that these changes are a response to the overwhelming blessings of God in our church. Let us praise Him for the need to

adapt and change, and for the opportunity we have to continue to be active in building His Kingdom.
