Sermon Text: Matthew 5:13-16 (NIV)

13 "You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot.

14 "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. 15 Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. 16 In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.

#### **Message From Pastor JR**

This week we learned that Jesus never said, "It's easy to enter the Kingdom." He actually said quite the contrary. It is difficult to enter the Kingdom. He said that it would be easier for a camel to go through the eye of the needle than for a rich man to enter the Kingdom of Heaven. For many years, this statement by Jesus was concerning to me. In my mind it would be impossible for a camel to go through the eye of the needle. The problem is that I didn't understand the scripture in its context. Rather, I was interpreting it in my modern understanding. The eye of the needle to the Disciples meant something much different than it means to us today. The eye of the needle was a small opening in the wall of city, particularly Jerusalem in Jesus teaching to the Disciples. While the opening was small, it was certainly large enough for a camel to get through. But getting the camel through took some effort. Typically, the camel would have to be unloaded to fit through eye of the needle. Even unloaded it would have been a very tight fit. Jesus is teaching the Disciples that it's not impossible to enter the Kingdom of Heaven, but it certainly requires us to let go of the things of the world. Jesus must be at the very top of our priority list at all times. If anything is above Jesus, then that thing becomes our object of worship. If we want to enter the Kingdom of God, it will require our willingness to put Jesus above everything else in our lives.
