Sermon Text: Matthew 19:23-30 (NIV)

23 Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Truly I tell you, it is hard for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of heaven. 24 Again I tell you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God."

25 When the disciples heard this, they were greatly astonished and asked, "Who then can be saved?"

26 Jesus looked at them and said, "With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."

27 Peter answered him, "We have left everything to follow you! What then will there be for us?"

28 Jesus said to them, "Truly I tell you, at the renewal of all things, when the Son of Man sits on his glorious throne, you who have followed me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. 29 And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or wife[a] or children or fields for my sake will receive a hundred times as much and will inherit eternal life. 30 But many who are first will be last, and many who are last will be first.

Message From Pastor JR

"Why do you call me good?" Jesus answered. "No one is good—except God alone. (Mark 10:18) In the second week of the "Things Jesus Never Said" sermon series, we examine the fact that Jesus never told us that being a "good" person is enough. Anybody can perform actions which the world would see as good deeds. But, as Christians, we should desire more than the perception of being a good person. In the scripture above, Jesus reminds of the source of true goodness. True goodness can only come from God. As Christians, we must commit ourselves daily to connecting with God. If we truly desire to be "good", it is only achievable through the Spirit of God working in and through us daily. Our goal is to bear good fruit in the world. To bear good fruit we must remain securely connected to the source of true goodness.
