Sermon Text: Matthew 11:25-30 (NIV)

25 At that time Jesus said, "I praise you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and learned and revealed them to little children. 26 Yes, Father, for this is what you were pleased to do.

27 "All things have been committed to me by my Father. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and those to whom the Son chooses to reveal him.

28 "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. 29 Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. 30 For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

Message From Pastor JR

"For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." (Isaiah 9:6) This week we began the season of Advent. Advent is a time of anticipation as we look forward to the celebration of Jesus' birth. As we read from the prophet Isaiah, we must remember that Isaiah was prophesying to a people in a time of anticipation as well. The Israelites were longing for a better future. In Isaiah's time, the Israelites had been defeated and exiled, but they knew that God had a promise for the future. Isaiah was reminding them of the hope that is found in the promise of the Messiah. Isaiah's prophecy came almost 700 years before the birth of Jesus, yet he described Jesus' life in astonishing detail. As we anticipate the celebration of Jesus' birth let us be reminded that no matter what our immediate circumstances are today, God's promises never fail, and He always offers us a future of hope.
