Sermon Text: Ephesians 6:10-20 (NIV)

10 Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. 11 Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. 12 For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. 13 Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. 14 Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, 15 and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. 16 In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. 17 Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

18 And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people. 19 Pray also for me, that whenever I speak, words may be given me so that I will fearlessly make known the mystery of the gospel, 20 for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it fearlessly, as I should.

Week two of the "All In" sermon series brings us to the idea of being all into scripture. Being scriptural is the first core value of St. Paul's Waccamaw Methodist Church. Scripture is the primary way that we learn about God and how to best follow Him faithfully in our lives. But simply knowing the Bible is not enough. We must invite the Holy Spirit into our reading of scripture so that we not only know what is in the Bible, but we also know how to apply it to our lives. In the scripture we heard this Sunday, Jesus was in the desert being tempted by Satan. Each time Jesus was tempted He responded to the temptation with scripture. Paul tells us in Ephesians that the Bible is the sword used to fight our battles and in Hebrews tells us that it is sharper than any double-edged sword. Another promise of the Bible is that temptation and persecution will come our way when we commit ourselves to following Christ, making it even more important that we armed for the battles we will face. Let us be committed to growing deeper through the Word of God, so that we can be equipped with the sword to fight the battle against evil and temptation in our lives.
