Sermon Text: 2 Corinthians 5:16-21 (NIV)

16 So from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view. Though we once regarded Christ in this way, we do so no longer. 17 Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! 18 All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: 19 that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. 20 We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. 21 God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

"Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ." (Romans 10:17) As we continue to examine the ways the we can be "All In" for God, we come to the idea of being "All In" through our faithfulness. As Paul tells us in the above scripture, our faith comes from hearing the message from through the Word of God. It is not possible for us to be faithful to God if we don't know God and aren't connected to God. If we truly desire to not only follow God faithfully, but to be "All In' for God through our faithfulness, we must commit ourselves to growing in the knowledge of and in relationship with God. Message from Anne Lawrence, Missions

Huge Thank You and Update on the Baskervill Food Pantry

St. Paul's is one of several churches contributing food to the Pantry here in Pawleys Island. Need for food has more than doubled in the past 5 years. In 2024, the Pantry provided a total of 6,480 bags of groceries to 15,837 people, plus 400 turkeys and hams. This is the Pantry where your gifts at Thanksgiving time and 24-Days of Food in December went. Year round, on a monthly, we provide canned chicken, most of which we purchase from donations collected on the last Sunday of the month. Less than 10% is physically donated.

For the past 3 years, donations have covered chicken purchases so none has been needed from the mission budget. We are exceptionally grateful for your monetary gifts over the past few months. We have enough funds at this point that we will not need to collect for about 8 months!! Thanks to all of you for your fantastic generosity.
