Sermon Text: Luke 6:27-36 (NIV)

27 "But to you who are listening I say: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, 28 bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. 29 If someone slaps you on one cheek, turn to them the other also. If someone takes your coat, do not withhold your shirt from them. 30 Give to everyone who asks you, and if anyone takes what belongs to you, do not demand it back. 31 Do to others as you would have them do to you.

32 "If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners love those who love them. 33 And if you do good to those who are good to you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners do that. 34 And if you lend to those from whom you expect repayment, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, expecting to be repaid in full. 35 But love your enemies, do good to them, and lend to them without expecting to get anything back. Then your reward will be great, and you will be children of the Most High, because he is kind to the ungrateful and wicked. 36 Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.

"Why do you call me good?" Jesus answered. "No one is good—except God alone." (Luke 18:19) As we study the first of John Wesley's "3 Simple Rules", we are exploring the call to do good. In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus is addressed as "Good Teacher". Upon hearing this, Jesus retorted that only God is good. What a simple yet important lesson that Jesus is teaching. True goodness can only come from God! So then how can we do good in our lives? The only way that we can do good is by allowing the Spirit of God to live in and through us. Repurposing of the current Youth Building for GOD's work

The Church Council requested a sub-committee to discuss and determine the best future use of the current youth building to support our mission to do GOD's work within our church and out into the Community and the World. It was decided that repurposing the building as a very flexible, multi-purpose/multifunctional tool that can be used as we are led.

After many months of hard work and effort, a proposal/recommendation was presented to the Church Council. It was voted on and approved. The work will begin March 10th and take approximately 3 months to complete. The building will not be available for other purposes during that timeframe.

The Sunday School class currently using one of the future large meeting rooms will begin meeting in the Sanctuary starting Sunday, March 2nd and the Thursday morning Bible Study lead by Gay Kelly will meet in the Sanctuary during this time. Other activities will need to choose another meeting room that will support their size as well. Please pray for this resource to be used as we are led into the future - forward focused.

Security Cameras and card access to primary building entrances

The Trustees' Safety and Security sub-committee is in the process of implementation of a Security cameras and card access system project. We are looking for volunteers to assist with the installation/mounting of cameras to cover the parking lot, primary entrances to all buildings and the children's classrooms, as well as the card access equipment for the main access doors of each building.
