Sermon Text: Luke 23:33-43 (NIV)

33 When they came to the place called the Skull, they crucified him there, along with the criminals —one on his right, the other on his left. 34 Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." And they divided up his clothes by casting lots.

35 The people stood watching, and the rulers even sneered at him. They said, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is God's Messiah, the Chosen One."

36 The soldiers also came up and mocked him. They offered him wine vinegar 37 and said, "If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself."

38 There was a written notice above him, which read: this is the king of the jews.

39 One of the criminals who hung there hurled insults at him: "Aren't you the Messiah? Save yourself and us!"

40 But the other criminal rebuked him. "Don't you fear God," he said, "since you are under the same sentence? 41 We are punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man has done nothing wrong."

42 Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

43 Jesus answered him, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in paradise."

Message From Pastor JR

As we continue our deep dive into Holy Week, we find ourselves on Thursday. The Thursday of Holy Week was a day of great significance. This is day is what we have come to know as Maundy Thursday. The Maundy comes from the word mandate. On Thursday of Holy Week, Jesus gave the Disciples a new command (mandate). This command was to love one another as He has loved them. Maundy Thursday is also the night that Jesus met with Disciples for what we call The Last Supper. At this gathering; Jesus washed the Disciples feet and taught them about the importance of being a servant, Jesus announced that one of the Disciples at the table would betray him, Jesus also told Peter that he would deny him, Jesus broke bread and talked about His broken body and shared the wine as a symbol of His shed blood because Jesus knew that the crucifixion was coming very soon. There were many things that happened at this final meal Jesus

shared with His Disciples. After the meal was over Jesus went to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray. During His prayer He asked God to spare Him from the cross and the pain that He was about to endure. But as Jesus ended His prayer, He prayed that God's Will would be done about Jesus'. What an important lesson for us as Christians. The idea that we should be praying for God's Will to be done above our own. Like most children we know what we think we want, but don't always know what is best for us. Through faithful prayer we can train ourselves to seek God's Will above our own. We must trust that God knows better what we need and what is best for us than we do. Let us commit ourselves to being faithful to God in all things great and small, trusting that God is working a plan greater than ours.

If you are new to the church, or want to <u>start using e-Giving</u>, you can sign up today for e-giving. Start by going to http://www.spwmethodist.org/ web page and clicking "Online Giving" at the top right of the home page. On the next page you will see a link that provides recently updated instructions on how to sign up and make your donations (<u>e-Giving Donation Information an Instructions</u>). You can print these instructions or review them online to setup your e-Giving donation and account. Please ensure you note your User Id (email address) and password for your account. You will use this information to login to your account to make any changes or review your electronic giving. Please do not create another e-Giving account if you have already signed up in the past. For those who <u>already use e-Giving</u>, a <u>reminder</u> that you can update your e-Giving account if you need to update your giving amount or add new donations. The brief instructions are to login to your e-Giving account and edit your <u>profile</u> information. You can update your donation amount, payment method and next transaction date. Brick Walkway Update

We exceeded our goal of 178 Engraved Bricks by 24. This brings the project contribution to the Discernment Fund from \$15,000 to \$17,000 depending on the cost to install the walkway.

The Brick Team thanks the congregation for their continual support of this project; without it there would not have been a project. We will make some minor modifications to the walkway layout to accommodate the additional 24 bricks and continue our search to find a suitable brick layer.

44 additional spaces have been added for church parking.

The spaces are located to the left of the Youth Building, where the dumpsters are located. Our church is blessed to have so many people wanting to attend.
