Then Jesus entered a house, and again a crowd gathered, so that he and his disciples were not even able to eat. 21 When his family heard about this, they went to take charge of him, for they said, "He is out of his mind."

22 And the teachers of the law who came down from Jerusalem said, "He is possessed by Beelzebul! By the prince of demons he is driving out demons."

23 So Jesus called them over to him and began to speak to them in parables: "How can Satan drive out Satan? 24 If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. 25 If a house is divided against itself, that house cannot stand. 26 And if Satan opposes himself and is divided, he cannot stand; his end has come. 27 In fact, no one can enter a strong man's house without first tying him up. Then he can plunder the strong man's house. 28 Truly I tell you, people can be forgiven all their sins and every slander they utter, 29 but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will never be forgiven; they are guilty of an eternal sin."

30 He said this because they were saying, "He has an impure spirit."

A Message From Pastor JR

Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things. (Philippians 4:8) When it comes to loving God with all our mind, we must first realize that there are two entities battling for control over our thoughts. The enemy would like to turn our eyes to things of the world. This will cause use to give in to temptation, and result in sinful acts in our lives. Paul instructs us that the wages of sin is death, but he also tells us that the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus. The angel on one shoulder and devil on the other is a very real thing. As Christians, we must train ourselves to intentionally focus on the things of God, rather than the things of the world. Ultimately, we have the final say in who gets to control our thoughts. The question is will we allow the enemy to have control, or will we allow the God, who loves us to have control? The choice is yours, and it's a choice you make throughout your day. Choose wisely!

Parking Protocol

Those that have been on the property the last couple of weeks during the day will have noticed a great deal of activity with our Sprinkler System. It has been totally repaired.

 In order to again not experience broken sprinkler heads, we are asking that you reframe from parking in non- marked parking spaces. Please avoid parking in Pinestraw and grass island areas.
Additional parking spaces have been created and signs pointing you to the gravel and grass area next to the paved parking spaces beside the admin building and youth building. If you have any confusion, please ask any of the trustees or church staff to assist with pointing to the extended parking as needed.

You will use this information to login to your account to make any changes or review your electronic giving. Please do not create another e-Giving account if you have already signed up in the past. For those who <u>already use e-Giving</u>, a <u>reminder</u> that you can update your e-Giving account if you need to update your giving amount or add new donations. The brief instructions are to login to your e-Giving account and edit your <u>profile</u> information. You can update your donation amount, payment method and next transaction date. Baby Shower for Birthright

Birthright in Georgetown is a crisis pregnancy resource center serving about 20 new mothers per month. From birth until the baby is 12 months old, diapers, wipes and clothing

are provided monthly. Special needs babies, teen mothers and those who pursue

education, remain with Birthright for >24 months. The organization is supported solely by financial and material donations, and volunteers.

We will hold a "Baby Shower" during May. Donated items can be left in the church vestibule where there will be a large container, or in Berly Hall. **Please don't bring items to the office.** Your gifts are greatly appreciated. Needed items:

- Most needed: diapers, sizes 4, 5 and 6.
- Jumbo packs of baby wipes
- New or gently used clothing, sleepers and onesies—size newborn to 24 months/2T
- Other items: diaper rash cream, diaper bags, baby shampoo/wash, baby lotion, jackets/sweaters, hats, socks, bibs/burp clothes, lap blankets, towels/wash cloths.
