Sermon Text: Romans 12:1-2 (NIV)

Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.

A Message From Pastor JR

What does it mean to love the Lord, your God with all your soul? You may be surprised to know that this is not something which we can accomplish on our own. Scripture reminds us that we can do nothing apart from Christ, but that we can do all things through Him. Loving God with all our soul is a great example of this. To love God with our soul requires us to connect deeply with the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit of God is what brings our faithfulness to life. The Spirit living in us is what causes us to move and animates our Christianity. Many Christians in our world are able to clearly articulate their faith with words, but struggle when it comes to living out their faith in a practical way. To love the Lord, our God with all our soul requires breathing in and breathing out the Holy Spirit in our daily lives. It requires us not only to constantly seek God but constantly respond in faithfulness to God's callings in our lives. When we as Christians train ourselves to live in this rhythm, we will increasingly notice God working in, though, and around us. This connection to the Holy Spirit will bring us alive spiritually and will have an impact on those around us, as they experience the Spirit in us. If you want to truly be used by God, openness to the Holy Spirit is the key. God desires to use you! The question is are you available to be used?

Parking Protocol

Those that have been on the property the last couple of weeks during the day will have noticed a great deal of activity with our Sprinkler System. It has been totally repaired.

- 1. In order to again not experience broken sprinkler heads, we are asking that you reframe from parking in non- marked parking spaces. Please avoid parking in Pinestraw and grass island areas.
- 2. Additional parking spaces have been created and signs pointing you to the gravel and grass area next to the paved parking spaces beside the admin building and youth building. If you have any confusion, please ask any of the trustees or church staff to assist with pointing to the extended parking as needed.
- 3. We are also asking that people notice the direction arrows on the pavement throughout the parking lot. The arrows point to the best way to maneuver through the increasing congestion especially during services, events and meetings.

Thank you for using e-Giving to electronically deliver your donations to the church.

If you are new to the church, or want to <u>start using e-Giving</u>, you can sign up today for e-giving. Start by going to http://www.spwmethodist.org/ web page and clicking "Online Giving" at the top right of the home page. On the next page you will see a link that provides recently updated instructions on how to sign up and make your donations (<u>e-Giving Donation Information an Instructions</u>). You can print these instructions or review them online to setup your e-Giving donation and account. Please ensure you note your User Id (email address) and password for your account. You will use this information to login to your account to make any changes or review your electronic giving. Please do not create another e-Giving account if you have already signed up in the past. For those who <u>already use e-Giving</u>, a <u>reminder</u> that you can update your e-Giving account if you need to update your giving amount or add new donations. The brief instructions are to login to your e-Giving account and edit your <u>profile</u> information. You can update your donation amount, payment method and next transaction date. You can also see your history of giving. Be sure to save your changes.

Birthright in Georgetown is a crisis pregnancy resource center serving about 20 new mothers per month. From birth until the baby is 12 months old, diapers, wipes and clothing are provided monthly. Special needs babies, teen mothers and those who pursue education, remain with Birthright for >24 months. The organization is supported solely by financial and material donations, and volunteers.

- Most needed: diapers, sizes 4, 5 and 6.

- Other items: diaper rash cream, diaper bags, baby shampoo/wash, baby lotion,
 jackets/sweaters, hats, socks, bibs/burp clothes, lap blankets, towels/wash cloths.
